- Low expenses minimize net tracking error.

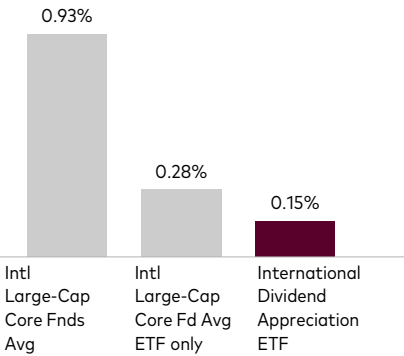
